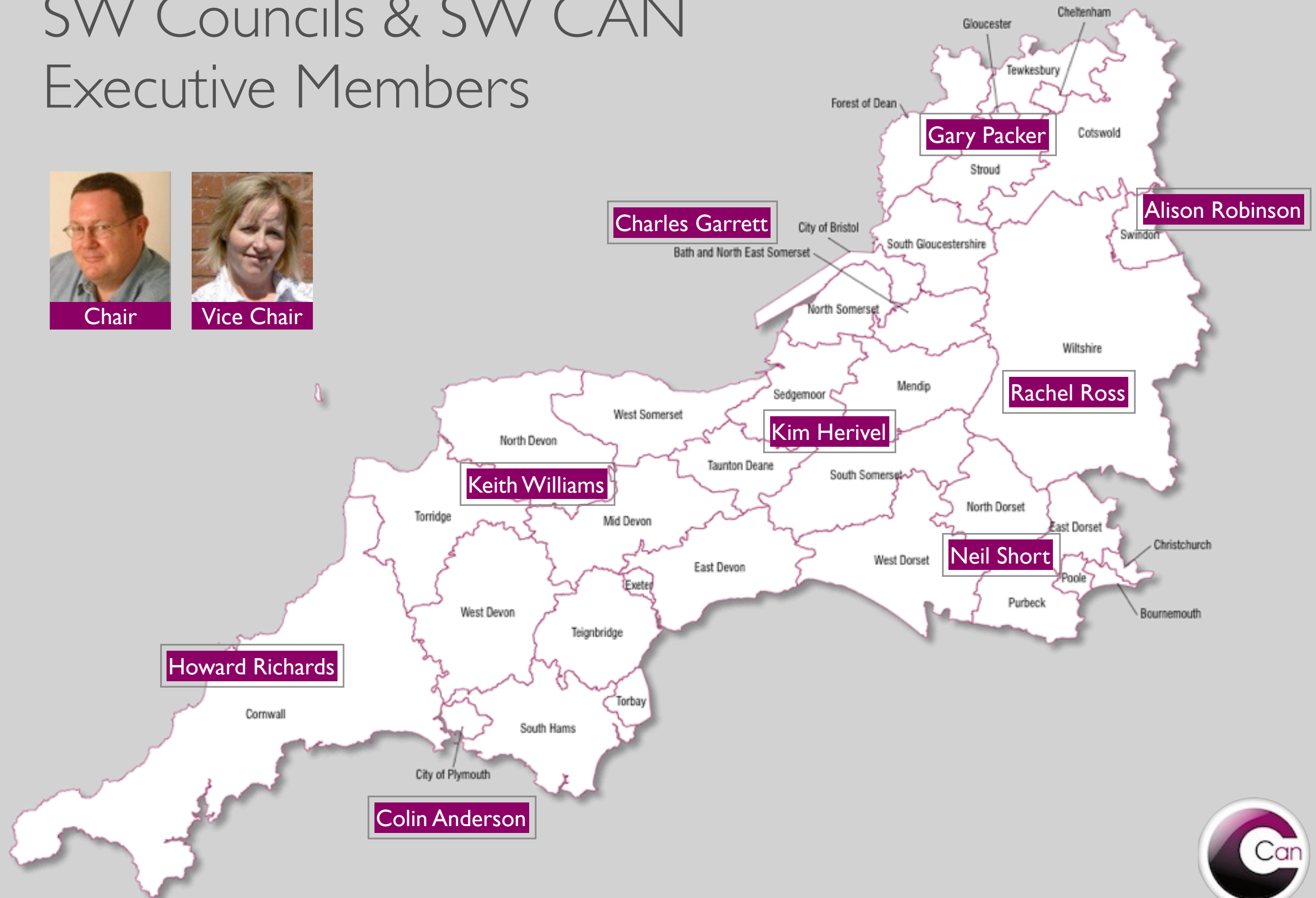

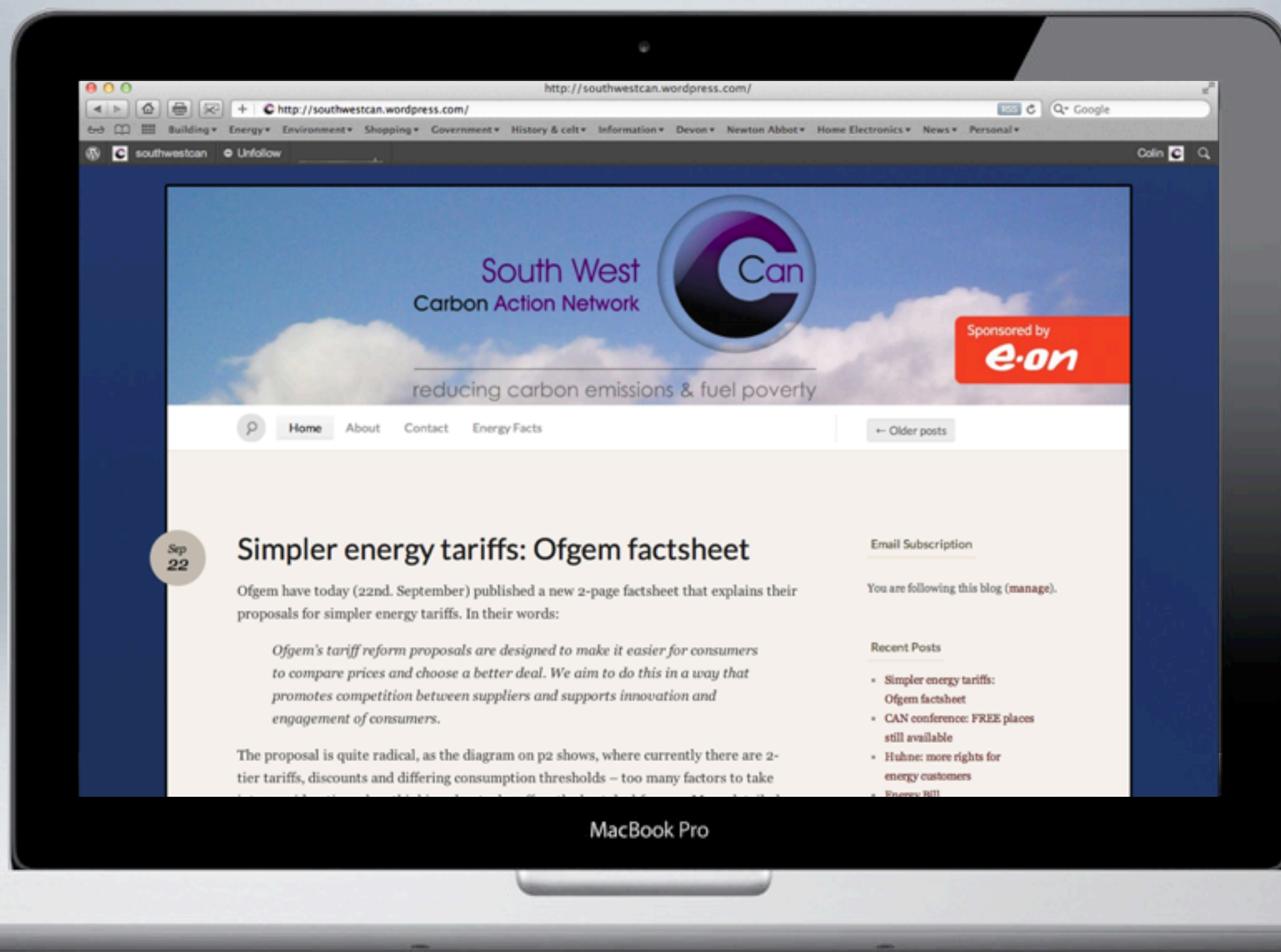

Introducing the Carbon Action Network

The Carbon Action Network

CAN is a network of local authority officers for local authority officers since 1997.

The Carbon Action Network was launched at the LGA conference in 2009. We began life as the UK HECA Forum in 1997, bringing together officers with Home Energy Conservation Act responsibilities.

CAN now covers the wider domestic carbon footprint, with the option to embrace the whole climate change agenda as our membership expands with officers from related fields such as planning, transport and waste management.

We focus mainly on climate change mitigation but also address adaptation and fuel poverty. We provide leadership, representation and support for local government climate change and fuel poverty officers, sharing information and best practice and building partnerships with other sectors. We are a formally constituted, representative and expert body

of officers, contributing to consultations on national policy and programme delivery.

The network consists of nine English regions plus Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Each region elects a Chair who represents that region at the National Executive.

The south west region holds four members meetings per year and provides a blog service to full and associate members. Associate members are partner organisations such as energy companies, energy agencies, manufacturers and installers.

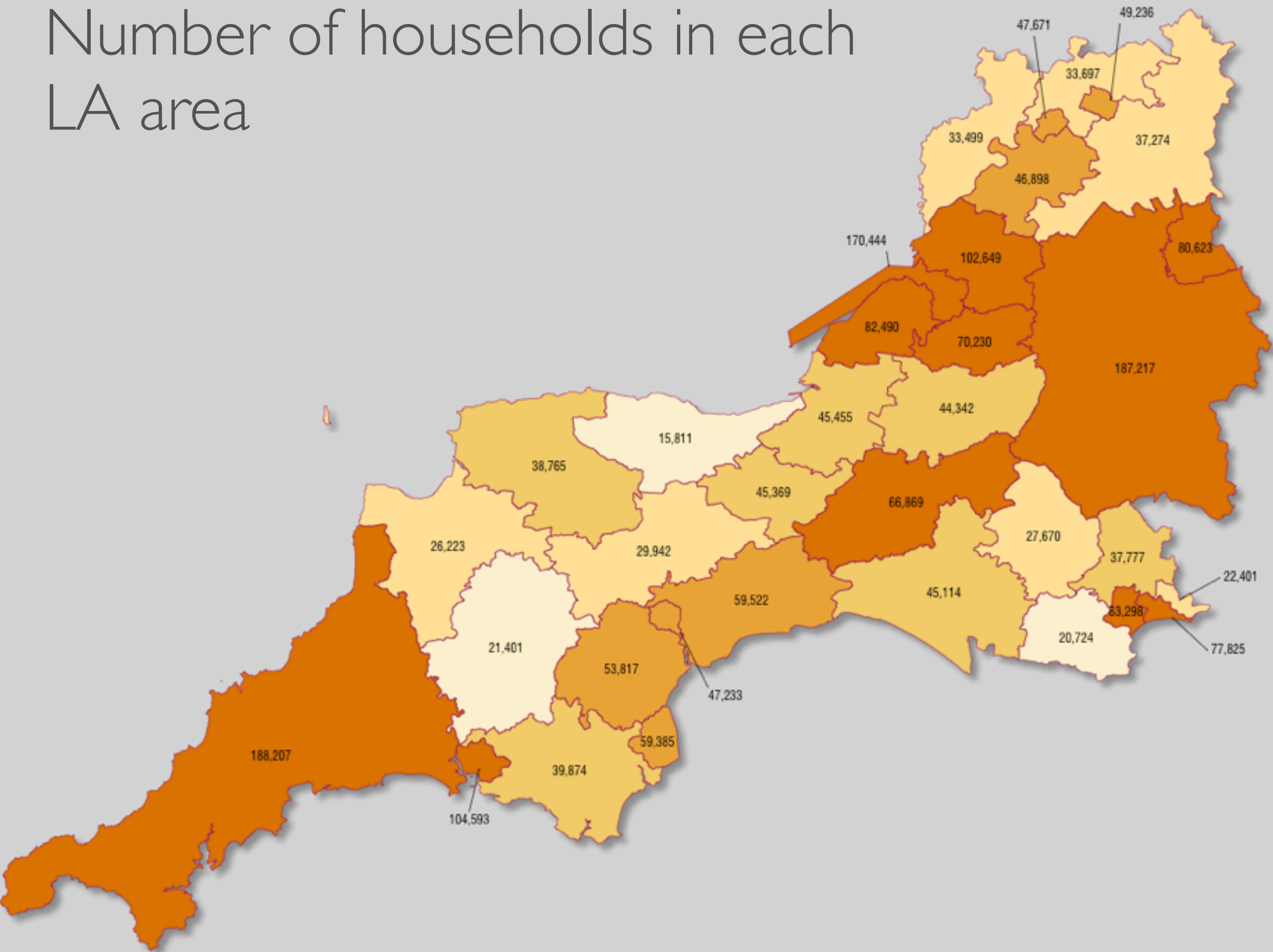

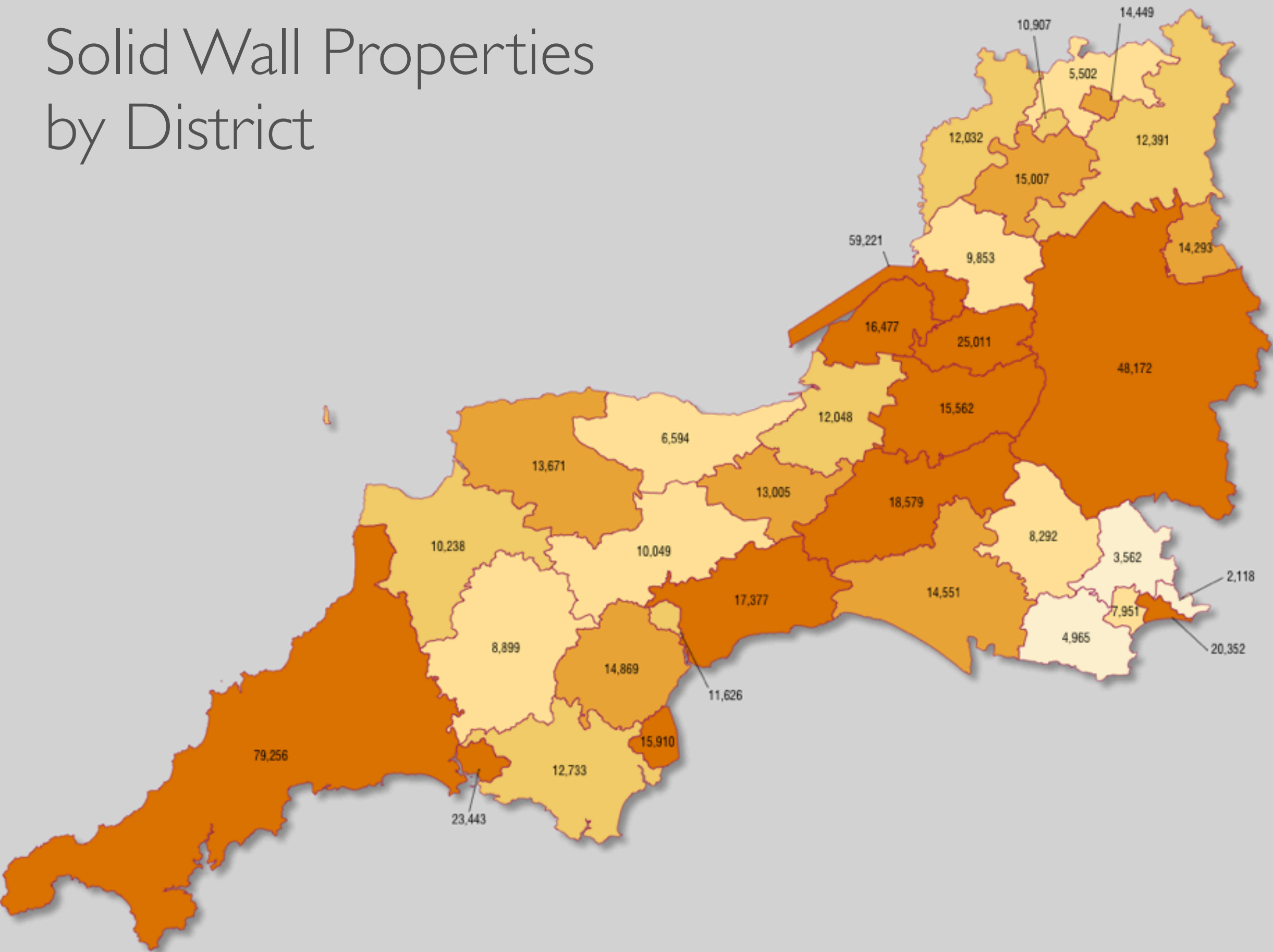

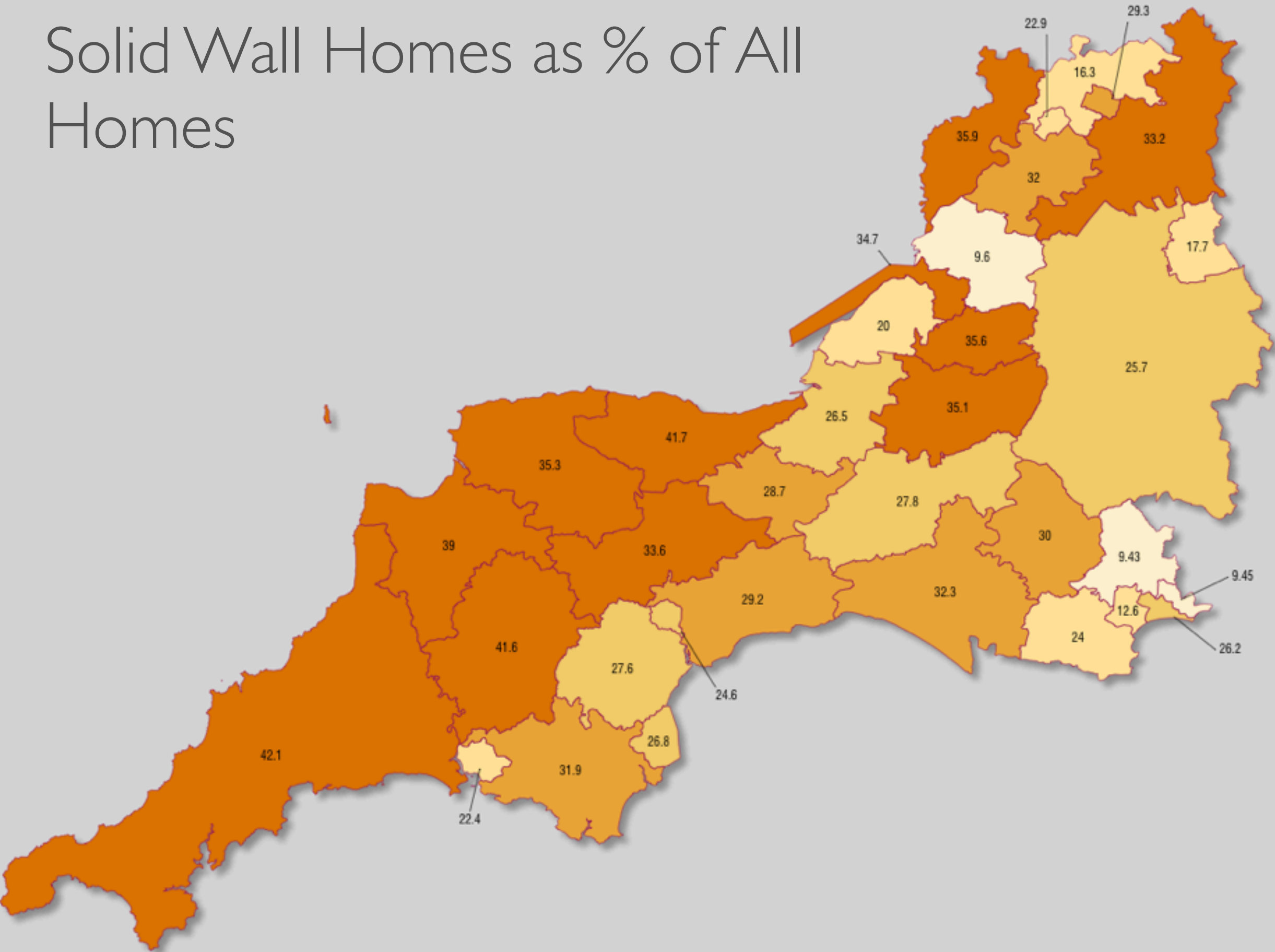
Number of households in each LA area
