CLIMATE CHANGE MITIGATION AND ENERGY

- By 2014 London's greenhouse gas emissions had fallen by 16% on 1990 levels – but behind what's needed
- The Low Carbon and Environment sector has grown by more than 6% in the UK in the last 2 years – whereas the global market has grown by 12%
- We want London to be recognised as a **global leader in reducing greenhouse gas emissions**, becoming a **zero carbon city by 2050**. This requires a **transition to a low carbon economy**, delivering benefits for those who live and work in our city

The Mayor aims for London to be a zero carbon city by 2050 and will:

- Cut fuel poverty by targeting energy efficiency to low income homes
- Install 100 megawatts of solar by 2030
- Support programmes to replace old polluting commercial boilers with cleaner ones
- Tender for the delivery of an energy supply company

EfL Supply Company

- Primary objective is to offer fairer bills to the fuel poor
- Tender for an arrangement with existing supplier for speed and to manage risk
- Integrate with other energy programmes
- In time, could cover broader objectives

- Focus groups at City Hall – to better understand Londoners’ attitudes on key policy areas
- In home interviews to at-risk groups
- Youth engagement – through the GLA’s Young Londoners’ Participation network
- Community Engagement Event
