1. National & Regional Updates

1.1 The Future Homes Standard consultation has been published (closing date 10 January). On the upside, it sets out transitional arrangements for very long term projects, so homes are built to current standards, not the standards when planning was applied for. However, MHCLG are stopping local authorities from setting their own, higher standards which will reduce the scope to set up carbon offset funds (although if all homes are zero carbon, higher standards shouldn't be necessary). Key to this will be how it's enforced. ALEOL is also keen to understand what the interim arrangements will be between now and when the Future Homes Standard comes into force (2025?): will we be able to collect carbon offset funds in this period? It was agreed that ALEOL will respond to the consultation and encourage members to do the same, in collaboration with technical colleagues in Planning and Building Control Action: RM to ask members for input by 9.12.19

Action: MOB to draft a response by 16.12.19 for comment

- 1.2 There is also a consultation out for the <u>Heat Metering and Billing Regulations</u> (closing date 9 January). This will require most non-metered heat networks (such as older communal heating schemes) to be 'viability' tested for the installation of individual meters. With an installation cost in the region of £500/meter, this could prove very expensive for local authorities and housing associations with older heat network stock. Also don't forget that the 4-yearly notification to the OPSS under the Heat Metering and Billing Regulations is due by 31st December. The notification form is available <u>here</u>.
- 1.3 The End Fuel Poverty Coalition is calling upon all political parties in the General Election to adopt <u>four pledges to end fuel poverty</u>:
 - Declare energy efficiency and eliminating fuel poverty a national infrastructure priority.
 - Take immediate action to improve the standards of rented homes.
 - Reform the domestic energy supply market.
 - End the Benefits Freeze and address the chronic scale of unclaimed benefits
