20-year statutory regional framework for spatial development

- covering a wide range of topics including housing, employment, transport, natural resources, etc.
- setting policies for local authorities to follow
- Adoption very soon

 - Transport




Adaptation in the Climate Change Policy

- Monitoring through sectoral indicators (e.g. planning permissions in flood risk areas)
- Concept of regional resilience indicator (combining social, economic and environmental aspects)

Generic Actions for Regional Bodies against Barriers



- · Increase the adaptation knowledge of and relevance for leaders and decisionmakers
- Pursue policy consistency through shared guidelines
- Tap into existing partnerships and networks
- Improve access to information and advice






